All three of our dorm buildings and the campground are in need of upgrades and repairs. We thought it would be fun to assemble teams of people for each dorm and the Grove: team Quillen, team Underwood, team Rowland, and team Grove. Each team would be responsible for identifying problems in their respective areas, thinking of possible upgrades they would like to see, raising the money to make the repairs, then, in 2019 when the campus fully returns to us, completing the work!

If this is something you are interested in, we will be signing up people all summer long and introducing you to your "team" in the fall through electronic media. We envision each team meeting sometime before the first of the year in 2019 with a visit to Ferry Beach by a few members of the team to assess a work plan. By the spring of 2019 we are hoping the teams would have some clear ideas about what they want to accomplish. Ferry Beach staff will coordinate the efforts to make sure that we are maintaining a consistent look and feel to all of our changes.

With staff support some of the activities will be able to occur in time for the 2019 summer season. In the dorms we know we need to furnish rooms with lamps, small tables, hooks and other things that couldn't be installed previously. We hope that each team has an opportunity to build their group over the course of the 2019 summer in order to complete their work by the fall and winter of 2019.

She shared how wonderful it was to have her daughter be a part of a community, which gave her some time alone with other adults. When I spoke to them at the end of the week, they were both gleeful and looking rested.

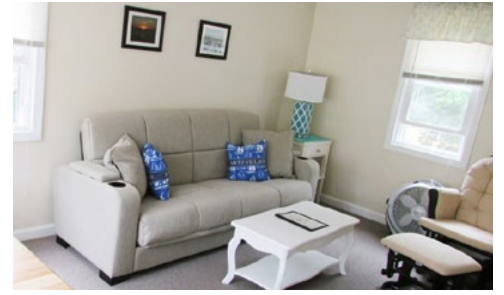

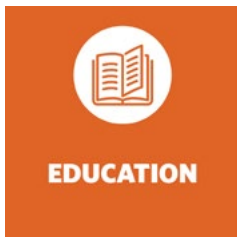
The **Metz Village** is a collection of private cabins that sleep up to 4 people, and have a living room, private bathroom, heat and air conditioning. The **Cross Cottage** contains private, hotel-style rooms that sleep 2 or 3 people, have private bathrooms and are heated / air conditioned. **Morris Cottage** sleeps up to 8 people in 4 bedrooms. Morris has a full service kitchen, living room, heat and air conditioning. **Kelly Cottage** is heated / air conditioned and sleeps up to 6 people in 3 bedrooms with 2 shared bathrooms, kitchen and living room.



Ferry Beach is a welcoming 501 (c) non-profit with a mission to awaken hearts to grow, explore and renew the spirit of universal love by working in the following areas:



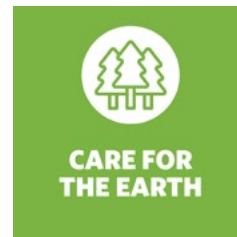
