Toward the end of the summer, our 3- compartment freezer in the kitchen finally died. We replaced it with a walk-in freezer which saved space in the kitchen and provided us with additional freezer space. Price tag: \$17,000

The Rose Pavilion

The Pavilion has been on our watch list for several years. We reached out several years ago, hoping that maybe the people who funded the initial structure would be interested. This year, we were forced to address the challenge. Our maintenance staff thought that we could get away with just replacing the rotting posts, but as we began to replace them, it was clear that not only were the posts bad, but much of the siding was as well. An inspection of the chimney showed that it too was falling apart and the building needs a new roof. It will be almost a brand-new building when we finish: new roof, walls, (additional insulation), doors, new windows (previously they were just screens, these will open and close, adding to the usability of the space) and a new wood burning stove. We're proud of all the work we were able to do from our budget and our staff's ability to get it completed. Price tag: \$14,000. (We are also grateful to Pam Emery, Ferry Beach Board member for her gift to buy the wood stove!)

The Quillen Annex

We will be taking additional bids and finding someone to take down the Annex. It is continuing to pull away from the main building and we need, for safety reasons, to remove it. Since it is intricately connected to the main building, it is likely to be a more expensive job than we would like!

Dorm Renovations

As we transition to a year-round facility, we are looking to provide more of the apportionments you would expect in a lodging room at a retreat center. We have four teams (one per dorm and one for the grove) and are planning

Each fall, a member center will host an annual retreat of center leadership and senior staff members to discuss the issues facing member organizations. We are also going to replace the chairs and redo the stage floor which is in bad shape. Besides the chairs, we are looking forward to heat pumps which will provide heat and cooling, making Rowland Hall a more usable space year-round!

We have sent another round of request letters to individuals we are hoping will help us reach our goal and then we are going to send to the general population at Ferry Beach. We have also been looking for grant funds to address this particular capital need as it will make the space more attractive to other groups in the winter, spring and fall months. Awakening Universal Love: Ferry Beach - A Not for Profit Organization

Ferry Beach is transforming! All of our conference and lodging space comes back to us this year as our long-term tenant leaves. We are already hearing from organizations, individuals and families who are looking to come to Ferry Beach. What were some of the precipitating events?

More than a dozen years ago, the UUA disconnected all "affiliates" from their organization. They did this for probably many reasons, one of which included the liability the UUA might be exposed to through those affiliations. Ferry Beach and other landed camps and conference centers were included in that dis-affiliation.

Ferry Beach has always been a separate 501c3 organization. That is, Ferry Beach is a not for profit organization which has filed a specific required tax form (990) with the IRS since 1936. Our requirement to do so is clearly visible on our tax-exempt status award letter dated 1986. Churches are not required to file a 990 with the IRS.

There has been some confusion of members over the years of whether Ferry Beach is a church/religious institution or if we were governed by the UUA. We are not. We have been our own separate 501c3 organization since 1936. With the changes we made to our by-laws in 2016 and Articles of Incorporation in 2017, we have affirmed our mission statement: Ferry Beach awakens hearts to explore, grow and renew the spirit of universal love. We have also affirmed our independence and courage to step into our mission statement, 365 days a year!

Not for profit organizations have their advantages. We have the ability to raise funds from trusts, foundations, corporations, individuals and other nonprofits. We have the responsibility to have a board of directors to govern and provide guidance for the sustainability and future of the organization.

We receive a huge benefit as a 501c3 to not pay taxes. We pass that on to our members and we provide a space to further our mission with workshops, conferences and activities that awaken hearts to universal love. We have a responsibility to use that public trust and the dollars donated to us wisely.

Ferry Beach has several long-standing summer traditions, such as having a musician and minister of the week, holding a Sunday morning chapel service, having a Talent No-Talent shows, bonfires several times a week with s'mores. Ferry Beach continues to provide our standard summer conferences, including: UU religious education week, youth camps, Family conferences, a gay men's week and other conferences that have become standard for us.

We have always had ministers who have come from a variety of faith disciplines, primarily Unitarian Universalist, but we have also had United Church of Christ ministers, religious educators, and chaplains trained in a non-denominational setting. As we are working to reach new people we may add more diversity. Many people come here for the spiritual and sense of community they get when they are here. Our legacy is that Ferry Beach was founded as a place where Universalists could come to have summer retreats. We proudly continue that tradition.

Ferry Beach is excited to be embracing our mission year-round with conferences and workshops. We have already booked much of May and September of 2019. We are hoping that you will think of us if you are connected to a group looking for a safe place to have a conference, meeting or workshop. As a not for profit organization, we, through our board, are in control of this big, beautiful ship! The waters have been a little rough and chilly for universal love these days, we have our work cut out for us!
