The new name for Unitarian Universalist Fellowship & Fun (UUFAF) is "Circles of Life!"

Circles of Life welcomes families of all kinds - with and without kids. Teens, singles, elders, young adults - however you identify and define yourself are welcome!

Like other Ferry Beach family camps, a day at Circles of Life begins with a 20-minute morning chapel led by our minister of the week accompanied by a pick-up choir led by our musician of the week.

This year's theme speaker is Rabbi Rami Shapiro. He will explore Joy in its many dimensions in our lives. Rabbi Rami calls himself a "Holy Rascal." His life as an interspiritual leader includes deep elements of Judaism, Buddhism, Mysticism, Humanism and Unitarian Universalism.

Grandmother Magic

So many incredible moments happen at Ferry Beach when we join with one another. Support of Ferry Beach makes this all possible, week after week, day after day, moment after moment, throughout the years. Family & Friends will celebrate 50 years as a conference this year. Here is just one example of its magic.

When I looked up from the sand, helping my 2-year-old grandson fill up and empty his pail, there were a group of older women surrounding us. "Oh Cathy, who is this?" "Oh my goodness, is this your grandson?" "Hey, this is Cathy's grandson!" "He is so cute, look at him, Mary, come over here and meet Cathy's grandson."



As I stood up, I felt surrounded by the love of the women of this conference, who had greeted grandchildren of their own families and many more of their hearts. They formed a circle around us. A "rite of passage" was happening and I was the grateful recipient. I stood up to join their circle as we all surrounded my grandson.

Like other mothers in family conferences down through the years at Ferry Beach, I traveled a long road to get to this place. Like other mothers, our daughters may have disowned us for a while, like other mothers there may have been nights we lay awake wondering if she was safe. Like other mothers, early on, math homework led to tears, sometimes shouting, sometimes a math book catapulting on to the floor. Like other mothers, the daughter we cradled as a child no longer fit in our arms, and we had to let her go.

Like other grandmothers, we soothed our daughters with teary quiet words over the phone, "it will get better." "You are so strong, you can do this." Like other grandmothers, we reached out with whatever support we had available to us. "I will be over in a minute." "I will send you money in the mail." "Let me call around to see who I know who could give us the answer."

Standing on the beach, as other grandchildren toddled up to play together, we were mothers and grandmothers cooing at little ones in the sand. Our shared experiences were unspoken, yet even today, my heart is full recalling the moment when I became part of that sacred circle.
