

Weathering the Pandemic: Sustainability Becomes Key for Next Year

As you may know, most of our funding comes from the work we do in the summer. Around \$850,000 is generated by our conferences and workshops from June through August. Our spring and fall seasons bring less funding, (\$350,000) but are integral in helping us keep staff and pay our expenses year-round. At this time, we have 6 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff year-round. Our monthly expenses with staff salaries, utilities, mortgage, etc. total around \$53,000/month.

We all know that sometimes plans don't turn out as you thought they would! This spring we were grateful to have many more conferences and workshops offered than we had in previous spring seasons. We even had a great spring break camp ready for youth. Then the pandemic hit and all of our workshops, conferences, retreats and special events were either moved to next spring or canceled.

We are so much more than a physical place on the beach. Ferry Beach is a not for profit organization. Our mission is to awaken hearts to explore, grow and renew the spirit of universal love. We accomplish our mission by engaging communities in the following areas: art & culture, education, spirituality, sustainability, personal growth and social justice & action.

We are grateful that our volunteer summer conference coordinators stepped up and helped us pivot quickly to create online offerings of our summer conferences. With the pandemic, the instability of our federal government and the awakening challenges to racism; now more than ever the world needs Ferry Beach's mission and voice in awakening our hearts to one another in love.

Our reimagined conferences will help us to fulfill our mission this summer. Our challenge now is to figure out how to make up the devastating shortfall in revenue. Several conferences have started fundraising through their individual networks; some of our sustainers have stepped up their monthly gifts and other members have made one-time donations. A conference goer sent a note with her gift: "my husband and I usually go to NYC to celebrate our anniversary. This year we are staying home, so we are sending Ferry Beach a check for what it often costs us for that celebration."

A father in canceling his child's registration for youth camp said, "Many people and business we know have been hurt by the pandemic, but we have been very fortunate. We want Ferry Beach to have this registration as a gift."

Another conference goer said, "I won't be able to come this year, but I want you to have our registration as a gift."

"Thank you for hosting GAYLA Reimagined. I understand someone was in the background making ZOOM behave itself. THANK YOU!!! I am sending an extra check... I hope the rest of your conferences run at least as smoothly as GAYLA did. Hoping you have a successful fund raising campaign."

An early contributor to the Ferry Beach Relief Fund shared: "I can't imagine not having Ferry Beach here for my children. I wish I could give more."

Under the CARES Act, Ferry Beach was successful in applying for and receiving a low interest loan that, if all criteria were met, would not have to be paid back under the Payroll Protection Program. We received \$149,600 and were able to use those funds for mortgage, staffing, and utilities. This provided some relief, but it doesn't come close to helping us overcome this year's shortfall.

GAYLA Reimagined

The Gayla conference community had looked forward to this summer to observe its 42nd year and assemble with the Ferry Beach summer theme of Joy. With the inability to assemble en mass on campus as usual, Reimagined Gayla emerged as a creatively adapted online conference offering innovations of standard Gayla features such as workshops, check-in circles, Friendship Circle, and a virtual "Sunday Hat" chapel. There was even an online TNT Follies, showcasing prerecorded performances, a very popular feature with the conferees this year.

Gayla Reimagined came to life from efforts of the Gayla Coordinators and Ferry Beach staff to realize the spirit to Gayla in a new way. With about 80 participants online (including some from Arizona, New Mexico, Canada and Nicaragua), coordination and management of online sessions became real learning experiences. Participants reported only a few technical glitches which were resolved promptly. The weekend included much learning about "Zoom."

In addition to the online conferees, a few men participated in Gayla Reimagined on campus pursuant to standard safety protocols. Among other reimagined features of Gayla were the Gayla Remembrance Service, honoring the memory of deceased Gayla brothers, and the annual Gayla Town Meeting, where the fellowship conducts community business such as election of Coordinators and planning for reunions.

Gayla Reimagined ended with a closing ceremony featuring the song Flying Free, considered by many to be the Gayla anthem. Goodbyes ended on a note of hopeful encouragement toward Gayla 43, July 17-24, 2021.
