We have started the planning stages of this years auction and have already secured some great donations from local and regional businesses. We are already looking forward to this year's event!



Whats New at the Beach

Every year guests are welcomed back to Ferry Beach to the familiar sights, sounds, smells and the spiritual energy of this place. So much has changed over the years as we have worked tirelessly to continue to improve the campus and the service we provide. We have made new traditions, developed new procedures and updated our facility. We now have AC in the theater - no more sweaty TNT shows! We used to have buffet meals, but COVID has taught us that cafeteria style is not only cleaner but creates far less food waste. Changes at Ferry Beach have been brought on over the years by ideas, concepts, goals and sometimes things that are just out of our control.

This year you can expect new (and hopefully more stable) WiFi across campus. We worked throughout the off-season to consolidate our networks into a single location and bridge a single network between each building. Guests now have access to a unified wireless network so there is no more having to switch between them depending on what building you are at. No more having your device drop your connection because its switching it self back and forth between visible networks! Though the connectivity and stability has greatly improved on our end - please remember that we are limited to what our area service provider can deliver. And even though we have improved the stability of the overall infrastructure, we did not add any additional access points on the main campus. Some dorm spaces and campsites will still not have a connection - but our long term goal is to continuously build upon this new network so our guests can stay connected wherever they are on campus.

Additionally we have made major interior improvements in Rowland Hall. You will find the break-out spaces much more bright and cheerful. We have added new lights and switches behind the stage (anyone who has run a TNT show before will appreciate that! We have decorated and have beautiful canvas photos of the beach hung throughout the public spaces. We still have some work to do in the theater - but like everything else: in time it will be done!

You will notice that our road name has changed. Morris Ave is now named Boardwalk Drive. Please remember this when locating the main office by GPS - Some systems may still have us listed as being on Morris Ave. For our summer guests, our registration office will once again be moving to the Quillen Lobby - so your destination will be 21 Ferry Park Ave.

One thing we hope you will be patient and understanding about is our staffing shortage. Despite all the effort we have put forth in trying to fill all our vacant positions before what looks like will be a very busy season, we are still short in some critical areas. Our registration team is brand-new and still learning (so please be patient and kind with them). Our kitchen team is small and we still need a sous chef and line cooks to keep up with our summer meal service. We may do continental breakfast a couple days a week so the kitchen crew can keep up with the larger meal demands.

COVID has taught us so many lessons - one of which is being flexible to changing situations. Please be kind with us and remember that we are serving hundreds of guests each week with out a full staff team. Many of us are working in ways we have never had to before. Our administrative and maintenance staff are finding themselves in the kitchen and registration, and everyone is pitching in to clean up and run programming. If you can help us while you are here we would love the support! If you do not wish to, that's ok too. We just ask guests this year to be supportive and understanding while we continue to work through another challenge. Thank you and we look forward to seeing each of you this summer!
