## Unexpected Grief, Surprising Joy

There is a Yiddish proverb: "We plan, God laughs." As a child, this idea was lost on me, but I remember my nana saying it with amusement. Irish Catholic, salt of the earth, born and raised in NYC, my grandmother rolled with the challenging lessons life handed to her while raising 7 children in a NYC tenement building during the Great Depression. Her strong faith, sprinkled throughout her tough cigarette smoking exterior, and NYC accent, came through loud and clear. When detours popped up in her life, God pointed another way.

She was a tither, and her savings plan was that. As the collection basket came around in church she would always whisper, part prayer, part admonishment: "Gawd, this is my last dollah." She was never let down (that I knew about, anyway), and she taught me about circulation when I knew she didn't have money herself. When we visited, she would grab my fist and shove a twenty-dollar bill into it and say "give this to your mother."

Our savings plan at Ferry Beach was a bit more strategic and less faith filled than my nana's when we were thinking about the transition set to occur when our long-term tenant left in 2019. We saved \$180,000 to help us through the changing business model. We knew this money would be useful to us during our anticipated growing phase. The funds did help us tremendously, just not exactly the way we had planned for them to.

Though we had a path set for Ferry Beach in 2019, the world had different ideas. The money we had saved was put to good use – ensuring our organization could stay afloat during uncertain times in a global pandemic. A core part of our income that we rely on in the spring and fall have always been church groups. The pandemic forced some churches to close and many to shrink. We have lost a substantial number of individuals who came to Ferry Beach with their churches and those funds were not as sustainable. The detour we took during the pandemic required us to learn and grow in ways we hadn't anticipated or prepared for.

We are just now starting to feel like some recovery from that detour. Our off-season groups are starting to **(Continue Pg. 3)**

## You're a Mean One, Mister Grinch!

Regionally, what we were referring to as the "Grinch" storm that came through on Christmas Eve, ended up causing a massive number of major power outages and damage across the state on Maine. After the storm departed the area temperatures plummeted. Many in Maine celebrated Christmas in the dark and without heat. Saco was not immune from the damages from this storm.

During a routine check of the campus on Christmas Day, it was discovered that we had pipes burst in DeWolfe Dining room because the power outage resulted in the loss of heat. Water poured from a pipe outside of the bathrooms and a sprinkler head in the attic also burst, which flooded the kitchen.

In all, we suffered damage to the whole of the north wall in the dining room (beverage bar, long bank of cabinets where toasters sit) and then a good portion of the wall on the west side of the kitchen. We also suffered damage to the walls and ceiling in the vestibule area. Ferry Beach did not lose much in the way of food or dry goods, but most light fixtures in the women's bathroom as well as the kitchen will need to be replaced along with sprinkler heads and some electrical boxes.

Going forward, we need to insulate the areas above the vestibule and bathrooms as well as the attic. These are outside of the purview of our insurance claim for repairing the damage.

Additionally, we need to purchase a generator to prevent the loss of heat in a future outage. Estimates to purchase and install a generator that would power the heaters would be around \$25,000. It would be set up to automatically turn on when the power goes out.

To be better prepared in the future with insulation and a generator we will need to raise \$60,000. We appreciate the all the help you provided to us that assisted us through the pandemic. We want to put the building back together in a way that prevents this from happening again and we hope for your support in doing that!

Ferry Beach is a magical place that welcomes all who support our mission and values. Perhaps the pandemic, with as much heartache, pain, and misery as it caused us as an organization and as humans, has provided us with gift: The ability to grow into our 365 day per year model. With new spaces created over the pandemic allowing us to host bigger groups year-round (Rowland Hall) and a growing professional staff team that we were unable to have during the pandemic, we are in a great position for the future.

Though we hit a huge speed bump, we learned about our organization's strength, determination and ability to overcome the toughest of challenges. We are feeling brave, confident and stable as we work to share Ferry Beach with those who support our mission. Thank you to all of those who believed in us and supported us along the way.
