The Cost of Food



Each time we meet with our compatriots in the hospitality industry, we hear about the challenges with food and labor costs. Industry standards say that whatever amount you are charging for food, 30% of the total is actual food, 70% is labor and utilities (have you looked at your utility bill lately?)

For us our challenges include the cost of food, labor, utilities, and maintenance. We have been upgrading or repairing much of our equipment in the last year, putting in a generator in 2023. In the last year, food cost increases in restaurants have averaged 6.7% per month since COVID.



What is driving costs? Supply chain issues are still a part of the problem, along with increases in fuel costs which drive up the cost of preparing and distributing food. Labor costs have increased tremendously, with the average starting summer wage at \$14-15 here at Ferry Beach.



high food prices continue through 2023 — including eggs, largely due to the avian flu, and wheat and oils due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the impact of sanctions.

Coffee and wheat are up 20%; eggs up 40% from last year. Our utilities in Maine are up. Rate hikes for utilities in Maine were approved to go up by 24% this year. Next year the average rate payer will pay about 30% more than what they are paying now.

To offset the costs this year, we will be cutting down on single serve packaging (think chips, cookies, snacks) as well as extra breakfast items. We are also doing away with single serve items for sustainability and the environment. Fresh fruit might not be every day, nor yogurt. We will look at other ways to save money while not affecting quality. A salad bar this year, post COVID will give people more variety and to serve themselves.

While we had hoped not to go up too much in food charges for 2024, we may be forced to do something to offset the challenges we are seeing. Thanks for your patience as we work to provide a wonderful experience.
