A Changing Industry

A recent article in The Atlantic (How America Got Mean, by David Brooks) caught my eye. Hospitality workers post pandemic are more difficult to find. He points out the importance of leaders of organizations to address what he calls "moral renewal" and what I would call "civility." Writes Brooks: "Moral renewal won't come until



we have leaders who are explicit, loud, and credible about both sets of goals. Here's how we're growing financially, but also Here's how we're learning to treat one another with consideration and respect; here's how we're going to forgo some financial returns to better serve our higher mission."

Working in hospitality, many of us have seen the ramping up of the sad/mad feelings brought on by the pandemic, our most recent world-wide challenge. From health care workers to teachers to wait staff to Little League coaches and parents, we are all curtailing our work in public facing jobs and volunteer experiences. The National Council of Non-Profits did a recent survey on labor practices and employment in the not-for-profit sector. Three quarters of the jobs in the NPO field that are left currently vacant or difficult to fill were the most public facing.

In hospitality, it seems that people are more likely to project their sad/mad feelings in emails and voicemails than they are in person. We are quick to believe that our rights are being threatened over a cost saving measure or something they misunderstood. Over time, workers on the front lines choose other jobs, leaving many positions in the public facing sectors of our economy, unfilled.

At Ferry Beach, our mission is universal love, and we are practicing radical hospitality, trying to go out of our way to meet the needs of all our guests and inspire each other to change cultural norms in ways we treat one another. We also have worked as a staff to find ways to take care of ourselves, making commitments to one another to have two days off in a week. Ferry Beach now pays a living wage and wants our staff to feel that we are supporting their careers, not just a job.

Ferry Beach made a commitment about 8 years ago to pay people a living wage, to create welcoming spaces for summer staff and to conform to the laws of the land regarding hospitality workers. A former practice of giving stipends to young adults and putting them in crowded housing was not in keeping with Ferry Beach values nor was it legal. While some people have called for us to return to those practices, we know that practicing radical hospitality starts with our staff and we are committed to our core values.

After reviewing our summer evaluations from guests, staff pointed out that for many who come in the summer, Ferry Beach is a great place to relax and unwind. Several conferees pointed out that they don't really want to know much about our values or our theme. They are good with the beach and their friends. And that works for us.

However, Ferry Beach is a not-for-profit organization with a mission. We live out our mission through our work. We are dedicated to embracing and awakening universal love through our six buckets. There is a drumbeat of violence all around us. Gunshot wounds have become the number one killer of children in America. We have taken away women's rights and are working to roll back the clock on LGBTQ rights in our world. The threats to our democracy are real.

Our moral renewal occurs each day here at Ferry Beach as we practice radical welcome and radical hospitality. As Brooks says: "Moral formation is best when it's humble. It means giving people the skills and habits that will help them be considerate to others in the complex situations of life. It means helping people behave in ways that make other people feel included, seen, and respected."

Moral renewal, radical hospitality or civility, Ferry Beach is leaning into our values of worth, acceptance, community, compassion, respect, truth, and conscience. Our staff, volunteers, and guests, may not always realize it, but those values make a difference in the communities we create each week here at Ferry Beach.

BOARDwalk by Roberta Altamari, Marty Burgess and Paul Provencher

One of our long-time members who was being asked to consider a board position, came to a few meetings of the board. After a couple meetings, she reached out to share that "I just really don't want to see how the sausage is made... I love Ferry Beach, but I love it from the perspective of my conference, and I know you need people who can see the big picture and must deal with all the challenges of raising money and taking care of the facility and all those other issues. I want to keep loving Ferry Beach for my conference."

We understand. Board work is not for everyone. Most not for profits who have staff also have a board that is focused on policy governance. This means as a board, we hold on to the wider view which continues to support the sustainability of the organization. Fundraising and resource development are big parts of our (any) board's responsibility. We have a competent staff to do the operational work and it is our job to partner with our Executive Director to guide the organization on its future course. It sometimes means making decisions which might not make everyone happy. Our recent board challenges have included how to recover from the financial losses we suffered during the pandemic and support the staff in a difficult employment climate.

Listed below and adapted from an article about governance by Rose Mercier, a not-for-profit consultant are some of the differences between being a member of Ferry Beach and being a member of the board.

As a Board Member, you...

As a Member, you...

- Must understand the role of a long-term investor who looks for sustainable long-term organizational success.
- ■Must ask: What does long-term sustainable success Often ask: What programs and services are currently look like? Are we living out our mission and vision?
- Must act in concert with all board members to oversee the governance of Ferry Beach. Board members must speak with one voice.
- Are required to look at the long-term and big picture
- Are primarily concerned with building an organization with a sustainable future.
- **■**Look at the long view of Ferry Beach.

- Have a transactional mentality and engage in a program or service in exchange for immediate return or benefit.
- available for me and my family and how much will they cost?
- Help influence what happens at the conference week they ttend by voicing needs and wants to volunteer coordinators of conferences. Members don't all have to agree with one another or speak with one voice.
- Look at present and their own short-term needs and wants.
- Are primarily concerned for the time they are here at Ferry Beach to get what they expected.
- Expect immediate returns or benefits for their investment of fees, time, commitment.

Some of our members have been on the board in the past and/or they understand the overall need to find ways to sustain Ferry Beach for the immediate and long term. Some of our long-term members who are also long-term donors, often have big picture good ideas that they share with either a board member or our Executive Director.

Generally, our members are looking at Ferry Beach from a very different lens than what is required of a Board member.

Members of the Ferry Beach community also may want to step into more of a leadership role that is not at the board level but more at the operations or program level. Most of our summer programs utilize volunteers in a variety of ways from being the coordinator of a summer conference to facilitating a workshop or set of activities.

Musicians and chaplains of the week are volunteer positions. Ferry Beach is always looking for volunteers who want to help create a conference, workshop, or event in the September through May timeframe as well. One of our treasured volunteer musicians is creating a monthly Music Jam at Ferry Beach. Another enjoys singing and she has offered to create singalongs at various times of the year.

If you would like to be a member and participate in a more administrative role, we are looking for a coordinator for our volunteer program called Beachkeepers. Ferry Beach is also looking for a Labor Day coordinator for next spring.

As we begin to look toward our Annual Meeting in June, the Nominating Committee will be looking for people who understand the big picture and the importance of the role of the board and would like to serve in that capacity. Our shift in these last few years into a year-round format, has broadened the scope and activities of Ferry Beach. We are no longer just a summer conference facility, and we are looking for people who can help us in that transition. Specific skills we are looking for this year include: financial acumen, skills in philanthropy and strategic planning, connections to regional or statewide networks and small business skills (entrepreneurship).
